





Then first-time home buyers Bertus and Marcelle van Niekerk viewed this Paarl house, they instantly saw its potential. "The location was excellent, it was just the right size, had beautiful wooden floors and best of all, it was in our price range," they recall.

Built 30 years ago, it was, however, in need of a revamp. While the Van Niekerks wanted to modernise it to suit their style, they could only afford cosmetic changes at the time, and these had to be done on a budget of R30 000!

Interior decorator Salomé Knijnenburg took up the challenge. "The first thing we did was paint the walls," says Salomé. "The existing colour absorbed most of the natural light making the house dark." ▷

## The house

A three-bedroom home built in the 1980s, previously renovated to establish an open-plan kitchen and living area.






All the door and cupboard handles were replaced with brushed steel ones and new light switch and plug point covers fitted. "This was easy and made a huge difference. It freed up money that we could use to repair the ceiling and install Venetian blinds and downlights," says Marcelle.

The area that needed the most attention was the kitchen, where the yellowing pine cabinets were an eyesore. Fortunately they were in good condition, so Salomé had them sanded down and painted white.

The sunroom, which has a fireplace and braai and functions as a dining area, didn't require much. The window frames were left unpainted to complement the furniture, and to soften the concrete floor, it was painted with a light grey polyurethane paint.

"The bathrooms were very small and opening the doors was difficult," recalls Salomé. "To remedy this, I replaced them with sliding doors fitted to a rail made from the old curtain rails we removed from the windows. The dated mirror tiles were removed and the walls were skimmed and repainted."

"We went over the budget slightly but it just goes to show that with a little ingenuity, small changes can make a big difference," says Marcelle.
